>>> MILK PACKET COLLECTION DRIVE


Delhi generates 1,060 tonnes of plastic waste every day, which is roughly 10.10% per cent of the total municipal solid waste that the city disposes OF daily. Eco club initiated to reduce this waste. Eco club members joined hands to recycle plastic waste by collecting milk packets. A video related to THE usage of the milk packets was circulated in the month of April. the students from classes 4-10, came forward to do their bit. 7,145 milk bags were saved from going to landfills. Later, the collected packets were sent to the collection centre and then, to the recyclers. These packets are recycled and turned into many useful products.















